SIBC and Carefree Boat Club, in conjunction with The Landings Association, have been working on plans to expand the Tiki Bar at Landings Harbor to enhance that beautiful, waterside location. While this amenity would benefit the entire island, it was our hope that the marinas and the boating clubs on Skidaway might spearhead an effort and provide voluntary funding to advance the project.

At our very well attended SIBC annual Kick Off January 18, we were thrilled that SIBC members provided cash and pledges of some \$2000, with Carefree Boat Club generously providing another \$2000. The Landings Association, continuing their partnership in this effort, will endeavor to expand the Tiki Bar, adding greater size and functionality. The plan calls for doubling roof size, expanding the platform and providing roll down sides to the bar to permit use during foul weather.

Funding any project can be difficult. As an island-wide amenity, Club funds could not be used, but we hoped members would financially contribute to bring this concept a step closer to reality. TLA, our partner in this effort, was willing to match our contributions with in-kind support.

Everyone, this is such a great response. Your generous offerings are wonderful. SIBC, along with partners TLA, the Marinas and Carefree, will continue to work towards implementation of this goal, and will plan on enjoying many "Tiki Tuesdays" with all of you at the harbor.
