I wanted to take some time this month and review the results of the SIBC Survey which has proved most helpful in guiding the SIBC Board and Social Committee with developing our 2022 event calendar.

43 SIBC members completed the survey. This was a very good cross section of our membership and represents about 64% of our active members. It was a very good gage on what events the club members want planned in 2022 and what our focus as a Board should be.

Some of the takeaways from the survey are as follows:

- Most Club Members replied they would like to have more on the water events in 2022,
- Most members attended one or more SIBC event in 2021,
- Most members read our monthly SIBC News Letter (95.2% of respondents). There were many good suggestions on how to improve the monthly newsletter and our web site,
- Of the SIBC events held in 2021, the popularity of events in descending order were as follows: the Year End Bash, Pontoon Boat Cruise/Dolphin Experience, Hook Race, Beer Can Friday Sails, Dockside Sundays, Tale Tales Event,
- The members least favorite event was the Sock Burning event at LHM. (This may be due in large part to the fact that the tradition of burning socks by sailors is lost to many.)
- There were many suggested events for 2022 as follows: continue Dockside Sundays, another Dolphin Cruise, cruise and tour to Ossabaw island, overnight boating excursion to Hilton Head, educational talks on subjects of interest to boaters/sailors about the low country, Sea song sing along, Joint ventures with Carefree Boats, recreational sailing with the sailing club, a day at the beach, a boating treasure hunt, picnic raftups with Carefree and many more...

I was very encouraged at the responses we received and the detailed feedback from our members on how to make your club more vibrant and exciting to boaters and sailors alike. As we plan our events for 2022 the SIBC Board and Social Committee will be guided by this survey and refer to it often.

One disappointing result from the survey was that a large fraction of our membership has not volunteered for, or participated on a committee. I want to challenge you to volunteer for our various SIBC committees or to help at any upcoming event. If you have time and interest there are several committees that could use help. We are in need of volunteers for the Public Relations Committee, Social Events Planning Committee, Membership and Welcome Committee, and the Charity Committee.
