Gray's Reef Ocean Discovery Center





On October 19th, a small group of SIBC members ventured out to the opening of the Gray's Reef Ocean Discovery Center and had a fascinating afternoon.

Seven SIBC members had lunch at the Crystal Beer Parlor, the oldest restaurant in Savannah. The Crystal Beer Parlor is filled with old historic photos and paraphernalia of Savannah and the area. We were treated to the history of the Crystal Beer Parlor by the Manager. It turns out that in the early 1900's, what became known as the Crystal Beer Parlor, started as the Gerken Family Grocery Store. It was sold in early 1930 to William "Blocko" and Connie Manning. The "Crystal" was one of the first American eating establishments to serve alcohol after the repeal of Prohibition. Prior to the end of Prohibition, Blocko ran illegal hooch and operated a speakeasy at the Crystal Beer Parlor. The name was borrowed from the Crystal Ice Plant next door. The Crystal Ice Plant is no longer in operation but the Crystal Beer Parlor is going strong.

Following lunch, our group walked to the opening of Gary's Reef Ocean Discovery Center. This was a fascinating time exploring the exhibits, video's and pictures that were on display of Gray's Reef and the surrounding Marine Sanctuary. Probably the highlight for me was the 360 degree virtual reality goggles that allowed you to spend time actually exploring the reef and surroundings as videoed by research

scuba divers. With the goggles on, you could see a loggerhead sea turtle glide toward you, a nurse shark snuggling into the sand and a school of black sea bass swimming by as if their movements were choreographed. Truly a unique experience. I recommend that you explore Gray's Reef Ocean Discovery Center. You will not be disappointed!
